

❄️ Snow and Weather Update ❄️

I'd like to clarify the school's policy on safety as we battle with the ice and snow this week.

Firstly, we grit the school main entrance pathways to avoid 'black ice' or slippery walkways. We do not grit the whole of the playgrounds, unless we are expecting to use them during the school day. To do so would be prohibitively expensive and should fresh snow, sleet or ice be imminent, the salt/grit merely washes away or freezes. Under the right circumstances, we will always try to grit clear pathways around school and through the playgrounds. You will appreciate there is a need for parents and children to take additional care when conditions underfoot are difficult and we ask that you help us to reinforce this with your children.

Secondly, we open the school doors early in extreme weather conditions where the health and safety of the children and their overall well-being could be an issue. Children will be allowed in school from around 8.40am and as a consequence, we strongly recommend that children should not be on the yards prior to 8.40am at the earliest, particularly when the weather is at its worst. Should the surface of the playground make it impractical to line them up we would appreciate parents support in assisting us in ensuring that children enter school in a controlled and safe manner.

Thirdly, when conditions are extreme and where snow or ice affect the surface condition of the playgrounds the children will spend their break and lunchtime in school, engaged in play and social activities. This will continue until conditions have been deemed to be suitable for the children to play outside. When the snow is fresh and conditions allow, class teachers may choose to take their classes outside to enjoy the snow; where the children have appropriate warm clothing and suitable footwear i.e. boots/wellies.

Finally, in the unavoidable position of having to close the school, we will inform parents as quickly as possible via our App, Marvellous Me, Twitter and Facebook as well as via the local media. However, we will do everything to keep the school open.

Fingers crossed we don't get the extremes we have suffered in previous years but if we do, the safety of our children, families and staff will be paramount. Please take care on your journeys to and from school and if you have any questions or issues then please don't hesitate to get in touch.
